NRFA releases K23m for road maintenance

THE National Road Fund Agency (NRFA) has disbursed K23 million for routine maintenance of various road projects and related activities across the country.

NRFA spokesperson Alphonsius Hamachila said in a statement yesterday that the funds were paid out last week to ensure Government's projects for routine maintenance of roads and related activities in the country are accelerated.

Mr Hamachila said some of the routine maintenance projects funded by the NRFA

include works on the Sabina-Mufulira Road to Mukambo, the Lufwanyama Road, Ndola to Mufutira traffic circle and maintenance of the traffic lights at Mukuba Pension in Kitwe, among others on the Copperbelt.

In Central Province, the NRFA provided funding for roads that include the Mulungushi Hydro-Lunsemfwa Road, Mumbwa-Namwala,

Kabwe-Lukanga Swamps and Mulembo River-Mkuku road.

For Eastern Province, the Agency disbursed funds for the Mufumbe-Malama Road, Kalunga-Chimlunga Road, Lundazi-Chitungulu Road, Mfuwe-Chichele Road, among others.

Mr Hamachila said the case was the same for Luapula, where the agency funded some routine maintenance roads which include the Mano Road, Tea Estate-Kalungwishi Bridge, Kawambwa Tea Estate Road, Mwewa

Road, and the Mbereshi-Kawambwa road.

In Muchinga Province, NRFA provided funds for the Nakonde-Kanyala Road and the Lwanya-Mano Junction National Park Road. In Lusaka, some of the roads are Linda Turn Off - Chikupi, Nampundwe, Old Kafue Road, Ngwerere - Chisamba Road, among other trunk, main and district roads in the province. Mr Hamachila named the Mporokoso-Nkhosha Road, Kasama-Mbala Road, Mukunta-Chezi

Road and the Kasama-Luwingi Road as some of the projects in Northern Province. In North-Western Province, he said the agency funded road projects that included Mwanyinga-Mwinilunga, Mutanda-Zambezi, Zambezi-Chavuma, and Solwezi-Kipushi Road.

The Chikankata Turn off to Turn Park Road, Muchindu-Dundumwezi, Choma-Namwala, Mukuyu-Chamwe and Simatika-Sinangile are some of the road projects that have been funded in Southern Province.

Similarly, Western Province has road projects namely the Mongu-Senenga Road, Mongu-Kalabo, Lukulu-Watopa Road, Katundu-Lukulu and the Kaoma-Kasempa Road funded by NRFA.

He said additionally, pothole patching on paved roads, grading and graveling on unpaved road had been introduced for effective maintenance and to improve capacity for small and medium scale contractors and thus enhance more value for money.

Mr Hamachila emphasised that routine maintenance was applied on roads which are in good and fair condition in order to preserve the road asset by keeping it in a maintainable condition throughout its design life.

Ms Wina was flanked by Education Minister Michael Kaingu,

Community Development Mother and Child Health Minister Emerine Kabanshi, Western Province Permanent Secretary Mwangala

Liomba and other senior district and party officials. Speaking earlier, Disaster Management and Mitigation Unit national chairperson

Patrick Chisanga, told the gathering that Government would soon send officers to assess the impact of poor rainfall in the district so that

relief food can be sent to affected places.

Mr Chisanga disclosed that Government had given enough resources to his office to transport

State will complete all projects-Mukanga

TRANSPORT, Works, Supply and Communications Minister Yamfwamukanga has assured that Government will complete most infrastructural projects by mid next year.

Mr Mukanga said the Government was still committed to executing all projects started earlier on contrary to views from some sectors of society that such projects had been abandoned.

Speaking in an interview in Livingstone, Mr Mukanga said the vision of executing the Link Zambia 8000 and other road projects had not changed.

"You will see a lot of commitments and work done on the ground in a few weeks' time. Our target is that most projects are finished by the end of this year and mid next year.

"There is a perception from some people that the Government is not working in areas where people did not vote for it. We are the Government in power and we are still committed to executing our projects," he said.

He also said the Government is still committed to ensuring that a permanent Bridge is constructed at Kazungula Border following the ground breaking ceremony which took place last year.

Mr Mukanga said the actual construction of the bridge would start soon once all logistics are finalised from Zambia and Botswana.

"We have had a few challenges over the Kazungula Bridge project but we overcame those challenges," Mr Mukanga said.

On September 12, 2014, the Governments of Zambia and Botswana officially launched the commencement of construction works for Kazungula Bridge across the Zambezi River.

The US\$ project, whose construction works would start in few weeks, would be completed by 2018.

It will be financed by the

Governments of Zambia and Botswana with financial assistance from the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) and the African Development Bank (AfDB).

State to resolve delayed construction - Mulusa

SPECIAL assistant to the President for project monitoring and implementation Lucky Mulusa says Government is determined to resolve delays surrounding the construction of a new runway at Kasama Airport at a cost of K144 million.

Speaking when he paid an impromptu visit to the construction site at the new airstrip yesterday, Mr Mulusa said it is important for the project to be expeditiously completed for people to realise the benefits of their investment.

"Government thought it wise to have a completely new runway at Kasama airport hence this new project, which when completed will accommodate bigger planes," Mr Mulusa said.

He also said Government will ensure that issues surrounding the squatters that have encroached on airport land are sorted out.

The new 3 km runway, which will be constructed to full bituminous standards will run parallel to the old 1.7 kilometer runway.

And the contractor, Anhui-Shuin Construction Group of China has already started mobilising materials for the project.

Company representative Lucie Hua said the contractor is ready to begin the works as soon as the consultant is engaged.

Northern Province Permanent Secretary Hlobotha Nkumbika said when completed, the new runway will help to boost the tourism potential of the Northern Circuit and open up the area to the outside world.

Phase 2 Nacala Corridor project launched

ZAMBIA and Malawi have launched phase IV of the Nacala Development Corridor project with a focus to enhance and promote regional integration in Southern Africa.

Meanwhile, the African Development Bank (ADB) commits USA 402 million for various infrastructure developments in Zambia, Malawi and Mozambique.

Transport, Works, Supply and Communication Minister Yamiwa Mukanga said during the launch at Cross Roads Lodge in Chipata that the opening up of the Nacala Corridor route was an important alternative for the inland importers and exporters with the region and beyond.

Its development would be critical in enhancing the competitiveness of trade and the economies due to the uniqueness of being landlocked.

"The importance of this project cannot be over-emphasised as the Nacala Corridor is one of the important trade corridors Southern Africa," he said.

Zambia along with Zimbabwe also successfully developed and implemented a One-Stop-Border post at Chirundu border in December 2009 which was the only fully functioning one stop border on African continent.

The benefits to be derived from implementing a one stop border post were immense including expedient movement of goods and persons, reduced delays, congestions and subsequent lowered cost of cross border trade.

Zambia and Malawi have developed appropriate frameworks to trigger the release of finances and to set up monitoring and evaluation mechanism during construction. Malawian Industry and Trade Minister

Joseph Mwanamvekha commended (ADB) for facilitating organisation of memorable event in the history of the two countries.

The one-stop border post was necessary in trade facilitation reform programme being implemented by the Malawi Government with neighbouring countries such as Zambia which was aimed at reducing the number of disruptions and processes associated with cross border transactions and to ease trade and movement of people.

Mr Mwanamvekha said at regional and multilateral fronts, one stop border post was also one important component of facilitating trade under the recently concluded World Trade Organisation (WTO) Agreement on Trade Facilitation.

ADB Malawi resident representative Andrew

Mwaba said the bank has committed a total of \$402 million for infrastructure developments along the famous Nacala corridor and establishment of two-one-stop border posts in three countries.

Approximately \$72 million has been committed towards the establishment of two one-stop border posts between Malawi and Mozambique and between Malawi and Zambia.

Road Development Agency (RDA) acting chief executive officer Kanyuka Mumbo has described the ongoing rehabilitation of the Great East Road from Luangwa Bridge to Mwami border in Eastern Province as cardinal for the promotion of the regional integration.

Malawian Road Development Authority chief executive officer Trevor Hiwa said some road networks have been financed by various incorporating partners.

Local construction industry making strides - Mukanga

The minister says there is room for improvement

ZAMBIA needs to improve its infrastructure and housing ownership among the masses to contribute to economic development, Minister of Transport, Works, Supply and Communication Yamiwa Mukanga has said.

Mr Mukanga, however, acknowledges that Zambia's real estate industry is one of the fastest growing in the southern African region with the potential to significantly contribute to economic development and poverty reduction.

He said at the close of First National Bank (FNB) expo on Thursday, that initiatives such as the FNB International Property Expo that brought

together developers, suppliers, transporters, banks, financiers and government agencies should be encouraged to enhance interactions on how to further develop the industry.

Mr Mukanga said the expansion of the housing market will also improve Zambians' livelihoods through job creation.

"Today, we have seen an increase in Zambians participating in real estate.

Zambia is slowly becoming one of the hottest property markets in southern Africa, and now all roads lead to Zambia," he said.

Mr Mukanga said Zambians should take advantage of the developing real estate sector by ensuring that they own property, unlike in the old days when it was difficult to do so.

"With this arrangement [expo] we have today and for the next three days, the public will have an opportunity to discuss with the best developers and the industry leaders in the housing and property business.

"Members of the public should not miss this golden opportunity, take advantage so as to climb the property ladder. The expansion of the housing market is one of the broadest and most impactful ways to boost economic development," he said.
