Air Transport Joint Seminar "Strengthening of Aviation Cooperative Ties between the Republic of the Philippines and Japan"

OSecond Air Transport Joint Seminar aimed at overseas development of aviation infrastructure through PPP (public-private partnership) is scheduled to be held in Manila.

O Sixty (60) persons from about thirty (30) enterprises, headed by Vice-Minister for Transport, Tourism and International Affairs will participate in the seminar from Japan.

In the Philippines, air transport demand has been increasing rapidly and many aviation infrastructure projects are lined up today, including the airport development in Metro Manila. With the objective of promoting sales by the heads of public and private sectors, by introducing Japanese advanced expertise and technologies for airport construction and air traffic control systems, the captioned seminar is scheduled to be held in Manila. The Council for International Development of Aviation Infrastructure, joint efforts of the public-private sectors, has organized the second round of such seminar and sixty (60) persons from about thirty (30) enterprises will participate in the seminar from Japan.

Mr. Hirosih Muto will attend the seminar to promote the sales by himself, and at the same time, push forward with the international development of Japan's advanced aviation infrastructures by holding bilateral talks with the high-ranking government official of the Philippines.
