Informal Aeronautical Consultations between Japan and China

The informal consultations between the aeronautical authorities of Japan and China were held on 14 and 15 May 2015 in Beijing, China, and the two have shared the view as follows;

1. Delegations

The Japanese delegation was led by Mr. Hiroshi Otsuka, Assistant Vice-Minister for International Affairs and International Aviation, Minister's Secretariat, Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism, accompanying other representatives.

The Chinese delegation was led by Mr. Han Jun, Director General, Department of International Affairs, Civil Aviation Administration of China, accompanying other representatives.

2. Summary

The air services between the cities in China and Haneda Airport during its daytime hours will start from late October 2015 (the beginning of IATA 2015 Winter Season) as follows:

Haneda – Beijing: Two (2) daily frequencies by the airlines of each country
Haneda – Shanghai: Two (2) daily frequencies by the airlines of each country
Haneda – Guangzhou: Two (2) daily frequencies by the airlines of each country

The air services between the cities in China and Haneda Airport during its late night and early morning hours, and between the cities in China and Narita Airport will start as soon as airlines are ready to operate, if feasible, within IATA 2015 Summer season.

(Note) While the framework to enable those services was confirmed by the bilateral aeronautical consultations on August 2012, it had not been implemented yet.
