## Aeronautical Consultations between Japan and Spain


As a result of a series of discussions between the aeronautical authorities of Japan and Spain with a view to expanding aviation relations, Mr. Ishii, Minister of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism, and H.E. Mr. De Benito, Ambassador of Spain to Japan signed a new arrangement today (20 May 2016) as described below.


It is expected that aviation relations and exchanges between the two countries will be further promoted through the Open Skies arrangement between Japan and Spain.

  - (1) Japan: Mr. Keiichi ISHII, Minister of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism
  - (2) Spain : H.E. Mr. Gonzalo DE BENITO, Ambassador of the Kingdom of Spain to Japan
- 3. Summary of Outcomes:
  - (1) Open Skies including Narita Airport
    - → Mutual liberalization of air services between Japan and Spain

(except Haneda Airport)

- (2) Liberalization of code sharing framework
  - → Liberalization including code sharing arrangements with airlines of third countries and code sharing on domestic routes
