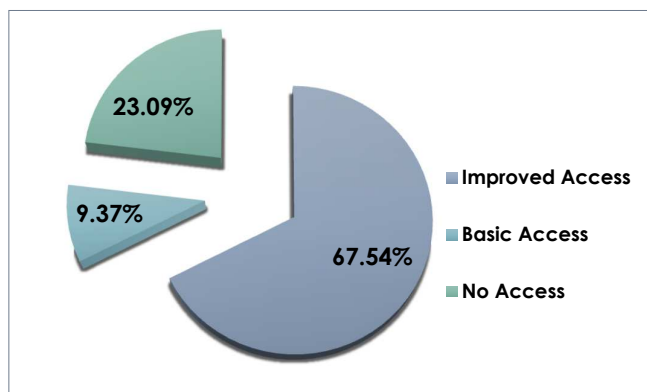

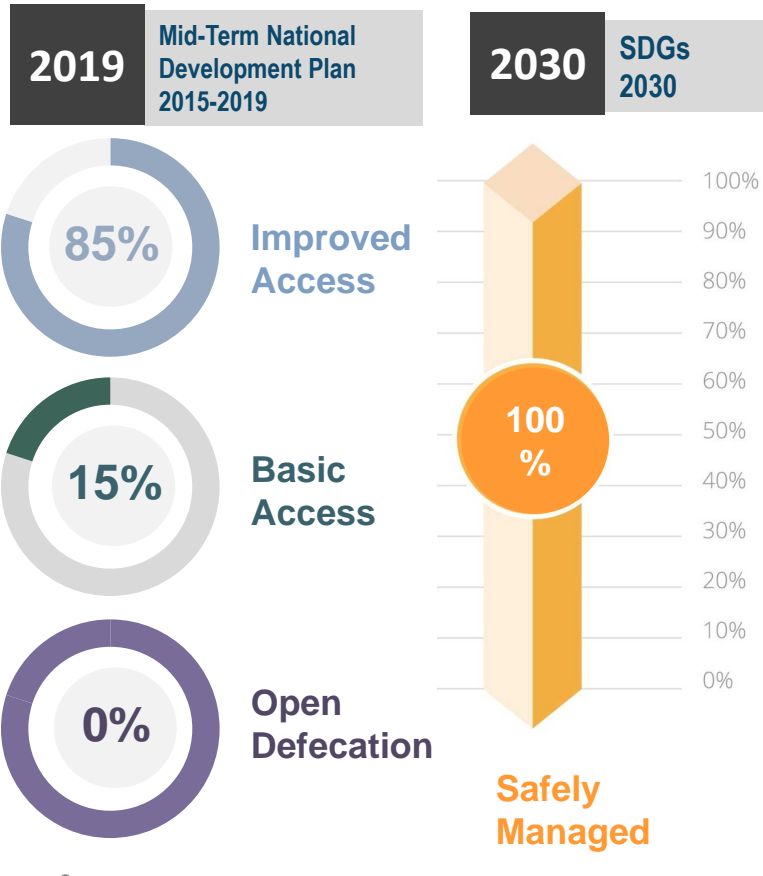
Current Condition of Wastewater Services in Indonesia

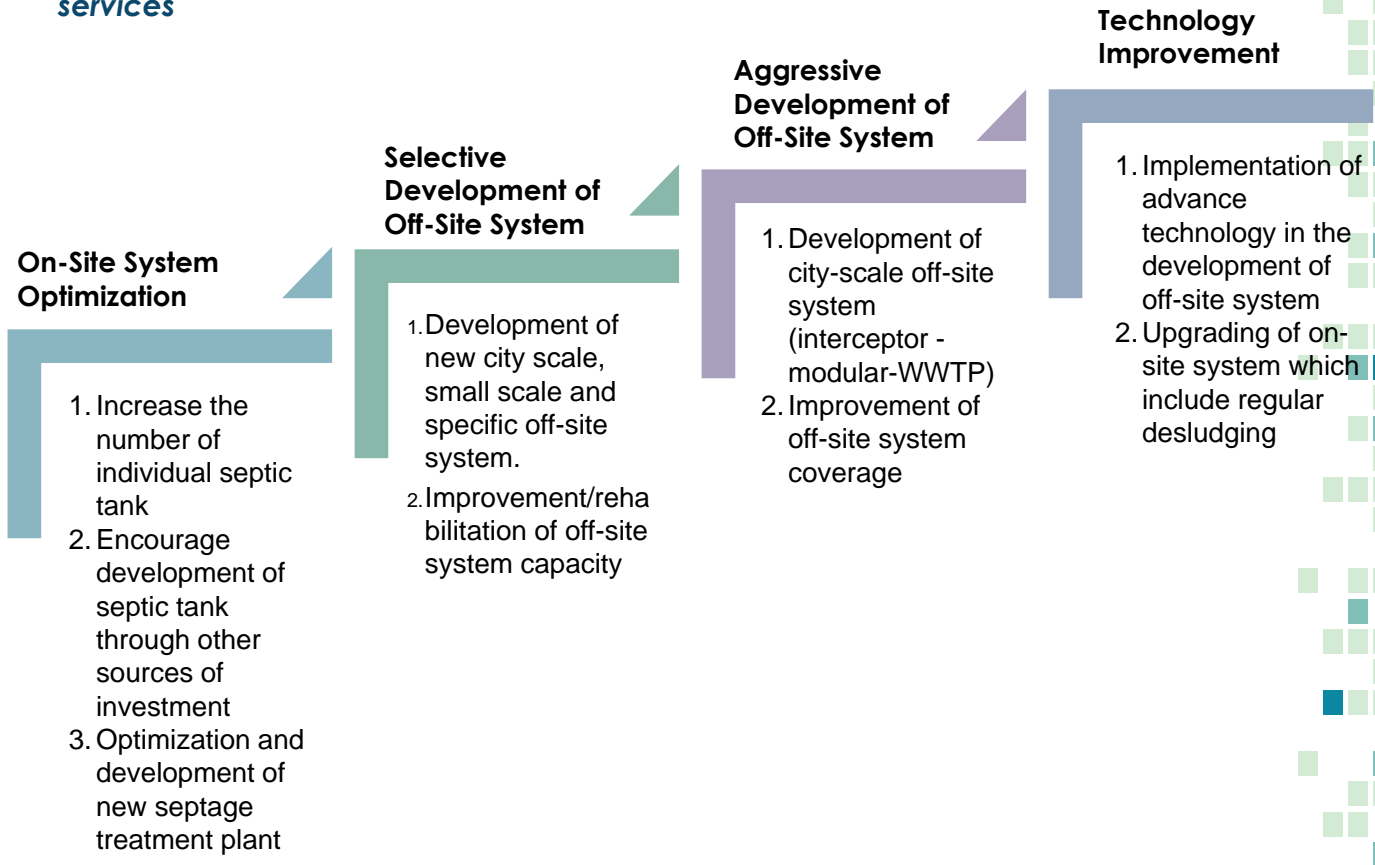

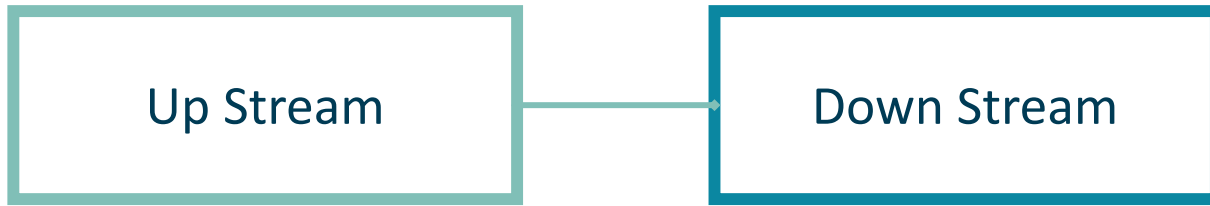
- 01** **Community Based Total Sanitation**

Stepwise approach is needed to improve our access to wastewater services

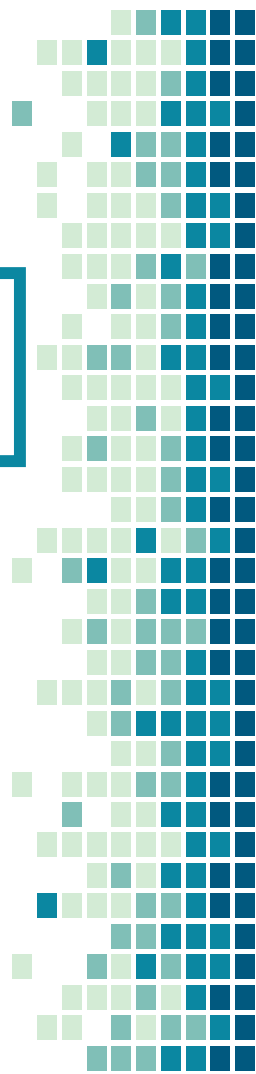


Issues and Challenges



- Majority of domestic wastewater is managed by on-site system
- Low awareness of hygiene and sanitation in communities
- Low quality of sanitation facility
- Low access to sanitation facility
- Limited land availability in slum urban area

- Polluted water sources
- Low effluent quality from on-site system
- High cost of investment, operational and maintenance for off-site system
- Non-functional existing sanitation facility
