Aeronautical Consultations between Japan-Brazil

The civil aviation talks between the Japanese and Brazilian authorities were held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil from April 8 (Tuesday) to 10 (Thursday), 2014. Please be informed that both authorities reached an agreement as follows;

1. Delegations

The Japanese delegation was led by Mr. Hiroshi Otsuka, Assistant Vice-Minister for International Affairs and International Aviation, Minister Secretariat, Civil Aviation Bureau, Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism, accompanying other representatives.

The Brazilian delegation was led by Mr. Bruno Silva Dalcolomo, Superintendent of International Relations, National Civil Aviation Agency, accompanying other representatives.

2. Summary of the Agreements

I. Liberalization of Code-sharing

Full liberalization of a framework for code-sharing with the objective of increasing operational flexibility for both Japanese and Brazilian airlines was agreed upon.

II. Enhanced Safety and Security Measures

Both countries confirmed the compliance with ICAO standards and their responsibilities for aviation safety and security measures and agreed to enhance cooperative ties accordingly.
