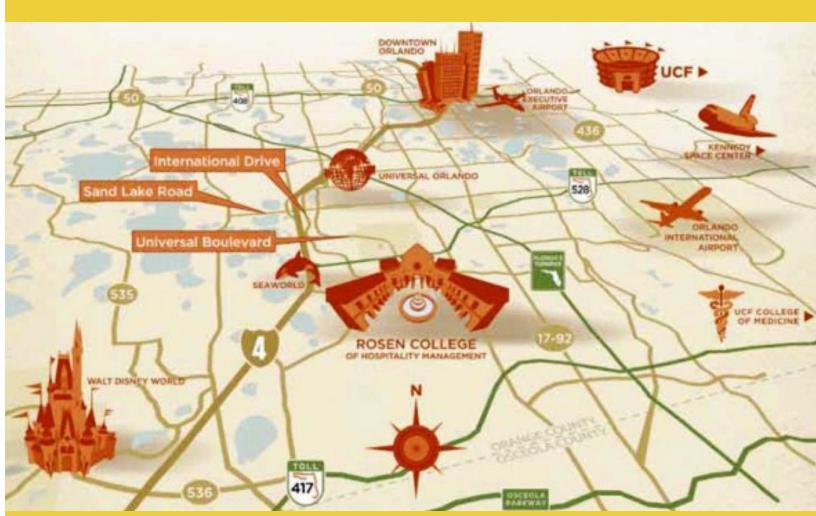

Professional Certificate in Luxury Travel Management:

The Rosen College Professional Certificate in Luxury Travel Management is designed for industry professionals and delivered face to face or online via our leaning management system (webcourses@ucf) with a combination of synchronous and asynchronous learning.

The certificate program consists of a two week intensive program. The proposed curriculum combines business acumen with the innovative thinking that is changing the way businesses function, grow, and thrive.

The coursework amounts to a manageable 6-10 hours per week of reading, assignments, and other activities that can be completed online. These assignments mirror real-word applications, with outcomes that provide the concrete experiences.

The Professional Certificate in Luxury Travel Management will include the following:

o Program Delivery:

Instructor led lectures/seminars and Industry Speakers. The courses incorporate formal assessments to provide a systematic way to measure students' progress. These types of assessments also contribute to the completion of the certificate, which indicates a student's mastery of the subject.

Used for generating student-to-student interaction based on an instructor-specified critical thinking challenge.

Case studies are used to explore how what students have learned applies to real world situations. Case assignments require students to answer open-ended questions and develop a solution to an open-ended problem with multiple potential solutions.

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HEALTH

REQUIRED MEDICAL INSURANCE

United States federal regulations require all J-1 exchange visitors and their J-2 dependents to hold medical insurance throughout the duration of their program.

THE MEDICAL COVERAGE MUST INCLUDE:

- ☐ Medical benefit of at least \$100,000 USD
- ☐ Deductible not to exceed \$500 USD
- ☐ Repatriation in the amount of at least \$25,000 USD
- ☐ Medical evacuation of at least \$50,000 USD

A copy of the medical insurance coverage, **in English**, must be submitted to an immigration advisor at the University of Central Florida upon check-in.

NOTE:

Willful failure to carry and provide proof of adequate health insurance is considered a violation of federal regulations and subject to termination as an exchange visitor program participant.

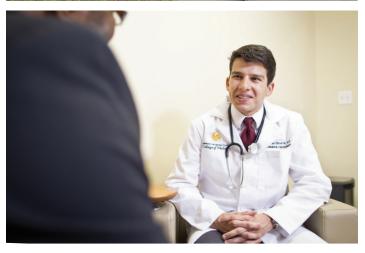

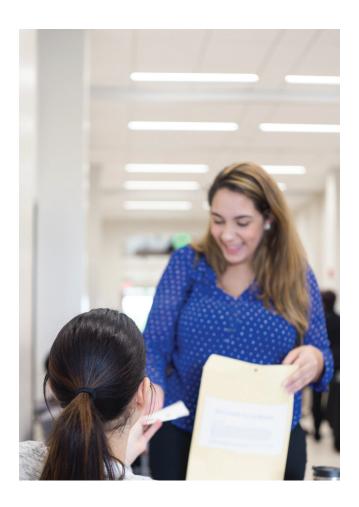

HELPFUL TIPS FOR YOUR VISA INTERVIEW

Each U.S. Embassy and Consulate around the world has its own policy for issuing visas. Here are some helpful tips as you prepare for your interview:

PROVE STRONG TIES TO YOUR HOME COUNTRY

As an applicant of a *non-immigrant* visa category, consulate officers will ask you to prove strong ties to your home country including but not limited to: verification of permanent residence, strong family ties, and well-established social/economic status. You may also be asked to communicate plans for exiting the United States upon completion of the program.

SUPPLY EDUCATION QUALIFICATIONS

Consulate officers will assess the educational qualifications to conduct your program in the United States. Be prepared to supply educational credentials in the form of diplomas, transcripts, and/or curriculum vitae.

VERIFY FINANCIAL SECURITY

Producing original and recent financial statements will help verify sufficient funds to support yourself and any dependents during the exchange visitor program. If the program is being sponsored, scholarship letters or employment contracts may act as evidence of financial security.

DEMONSTRATE ENGLISH PROFICIENCY

The visa interview will be conducted in English. Be prepared to communicate in English and/or provide English proficiency test scores.
