# Regarding the investigations made when creating this guide

When creating this Accessible Restaurant Guide (hereinafter referred to as "this Guide"), we conducted investigations with the cooperation of 109 eating and drinking facilities. They agree with the intentions of this Guide and are accessible from the Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic stadiums, their nearest train stations and other major train station areas in the central Tokyo area.

The investigation of this Guide was conducted by one disabled wheelchair user and one person on foot from November 2019 to February 2020. They conducted this investigation on the following points at restaurants where wheelchair users can feel comfortable. A majority of the photos in this Guide were taken upon visiting said establishment.

# Target of the investigation

### Doorway

Width of doorway and height of steps at the restaurant entrance

#### Interior

Width and height of steps in passageways and space to accommodate a wheelchair

#### Table

Height of tabletops, whether chairs are movable or not

#### Restrooms

Availability of multipurpose restrooms in or around the restaurant

## Payment method

Payment at the cashier, payment at the counter, payment at the table, buying a food ticket from a vending machine, etc.

# Accessibility

Minced food service, Braille menu, written conversation, etc.

#### For overseas tourists

Wi-Fi, website in multiple languages, foreign language menus, etc.

## Parking Lot

Availability of handicapped parking at the restaurant or at the site

#### Route for wheelchair access

Route for wheelchair users to and from stadiums and their nearest Stations
